new & noteworthy

- **Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District (SBCAPCD):** Coverage of requirements related to the control of emissions of organic compounds within SBCAPCD has been expanded by the addition of Rule 329, Cutback and Emulsified Asphalt Paving Materials, to the guide. The rule applies to the manufacture, application and sale of cutback and emulsified asphalt materials for the paving, construction and maintenance of streets, highways, parking lots and driveways.

This rule has been added to **Air Quality Management in Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District, Rulebook B, Organic Compounds**.

highlights of this release

- **Air Quality Management in SBCAPCD** has been updated as follows:
 - In the Introduction, the **General Applicability Checklist** was revised to reflect the addition of Rule 329, Cutback and Emulsified Asphalt Paving Materials.
 - **Rulebook B, Organic Compounds**, was updated to add Rule 329, Cutback and Emulsified Asphalt Paving Materials.

did you know?

- On June 30, 2020, SBCAPCD's Approved Emission Factors for Toxics Air Contaminants (TACs) document, as well as the spreadsheet of approved TAC emission factors, were updated. The Approved Emission Factors for Toxic Air Contaminants discusses the emission factors approved by the SBCAPCD for calculating emissions of TACs for health risk assessments.
