



## Environmental Auditing: Air Quality Management in San Diego

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### new & noteworthy

- **San Diego County Air Pollution Control District Revises Toxic Air Contaminant Rule:** On September 29, 2020, the San Diego Air Pollution Control District (SDAPCD) revised Rule 1210, Toxic Air Contaminant Public Health Risks-Public Notification and Risk Reduction in order to update Table II (Toxic Air Contaminants for Which Potential Chronic Noncancer Impacts Must Be Calculated) and Table III (Toxic Air Contaminants for Which Potential Acute Noncancer Impacts Must Be Calculated). Specifically, this action adds Hexamethylene Diisocyanate (Monomer and Polyisocyanates) (Chemical Abstracts Service number 822-06-0) to the lists of compounds in Tables II and III because it has potential acute and chronic noncancer impacts.

These changes impact **Air Quality Management in San Diego Air Pollution Control District, Rulebook A, General Requirements.**

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### highlights of this release

- **Air Quality Management in SDAPCD, Rulebook A, General Requirements,** was updated to reflect minor changes to Rule 1210 (Toxic Air Contaminant Public Health Risks-Public Notification and Risk Reduction).

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### did you know?

- **Ozone Attainment Plan:** SDAPCD has prepared an Attainment Plan for San Diego County that demonstrates how the region will further reduce air pollutant emissions in order to attain the current National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for ozone. The Attainment Plan was approved by the District on October 14, 2020, and has been submitted to the California Air Resources Board for their approval. If the plan is approved it will then be submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency as a revision to the California State Implementation Plan (SIP) for attaining the ozone NAAQS.
