



Environmental Auditing: Air Quality Management in Santa Barbara

new & noteworthy

- **Santa Barbara Air Pollution Control District (SBAPCD) Fees:** Effective July 1, 2021, SBAPCD has amended the fee schedules in Rule 210, which sets fees relating to permits and other programs, and Rule 213, which sets district fees for registration programs. This action incorporates annual fee adjustments based on the California Consumer Price Index (CPI) changes. For Fiscal Year 2021-2022, the adjustments resulted in a total CPI increase of 2.65%. All fees invoiced on and after July 1, 2021 are subject to the CPI adjustments and the updated values are reflected in Rule 210 and Rule 213.

These changes do not affect the Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District Rulebooks, as specific fees are not discussed.

- There were no changes affecting the Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District Rulebooks.

did you know?

- **Air Toxics Emission Inventory Plans and Reports:** In August 2021, SBAPCD revised its Guidelines for Preparing Air Toxics Emission Inventory Plans and Reports and associated Modeling Protocol Tables for ATEIP. Additionally, the district's Approved Emission Factors for Toxic Air Contaminants document, as well as the spreadsheet of approved TAC emission factors, SBAPCD-Approved TAC Emission Factors, were updated.
