



Environmental Health & Safety Audit Protocol Ontario Oil & Petroleum Refining, Canada 2021

STP ComplianceEHS (STP) announces the release of its recently updated EHS audit protocol for Ontario Oil and Petroleum Refining, Canada. This audit protocol, which covers relevant national and provincial EHS requirements, was previously developed in April 2020. The regulatory date for the current release is October 2021. The table below shows the extent of regulatory changes that have occurred since the previous update.

highlights of selected new legislation

- **Cleaner Transportation Fuels: Renewable Content Requirements for Gasoline and Diesel Fuels [O. Reg. 663/20], 2020** regulates the amount of renewable content (such as ethanol, renewable gasoline, biodiesel, and renewable diesel) in gasoline and diesel fuel. It repealed and replaced the Greener Gasoline – Bio-based Content Requirements for Gasoline, O. Reg. 535/05 and the Greener Gasoline – Bio-based Content Requirements for Diesel Fuel, O. Reg. 97/14.
- **Petroleum Refining – Industry Standard [Version 3.0, June 10, 2020]** applies to a facility that is part of a class identified by one or more of the following NAICS codes: 324110 (Petroleum Refineries) and 324190 (Other Petroleum and Coal Product Manufacturing). It applies to a facility that is registered in Ontario’s Technical Standards Registry – Air Pollution in respect of this industry standard, is a petroleum refining facility, and has one or more of the contaminants specified in the standard. This industry standard specifies the technical and operational requirements for managing emissions of air contaminant(s). Version 3.0 replaces Version 2.0 of February 27, 2018, with minor amendments.

- **Petrochemical – Industry Standard [Version 3.0, June 10, 2020]** applies to every facility that is part of a class identified by NAICS code 325110 (Petrochemical Manufacturing). It applies to a facility that is registered in Ontario's Technical Standards Registry – Air Pollution in respect of this industry standard, is a petrochemical facility, and has one or more of the contaminants specified in the standard. This industry standard specifies the technical and operational requirements for managing emissions of air contaminant(s). Version 3.0 replaces Version 2.0 of February 27, 2018, with minor amendments.



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
